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Meet Steve Haberberger, Jr.



We would like to introduce you to Steve Haberberger, Jr. Steve is part of the fourth generation at Haberberger, Inc. and has been working at Haberberger since 1999, when he started helping out during his high school summer break by painting tools, cleaning trailers and organizing materials in the warehouse. In the summer of 2002, he worked as a pipe fitter preapprentice on a project at Washington University and was able to see, firsthand, all of the hard work and knowledge that the pipefitters of Local 562 have to offer.

In 2003, Steve started an internship at Haberberger while attending St. Louis University. He started as a project assistant and later on that year, started to estimate projects. Upon receiving his Management degree from SLU, Steve was brought onboard full-time to be a project manager and estimator.

Steve has focused primarily on Haberberger's power plant work. Steve has worked onsite for three major boiler outages and has run a handful of other projects for Ameren Missouri and Associated Electric Co-Operative. Steve's involvement with power plant work led Steve to become part of the quality control team at Haberberger and last year, he received his American Welding Society Certified Weld Inspector certification. Steve graduated in 2010 with his Masters in Construction Management from Washington University-St. Louis.

Aside from power plant work, Steve has worked on projects for Anheuser-Busch,, Washington University, and Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District (MSD). One defining job in Steve's career was the Holcim Cement project, in Ste. Genevieve. In the spring of 2009, Steve was a project engineer for two projects that Haberberger had at the plant. He says, "It was awesome seeing what all went into the plant's construction. Seeing thousands of people everyday working together was just amazing."

Steve lives in Oakville with his wife Becky and likes to hunt, fish and travel. He has really enjoyed his 7 years full-time at Haberberger. Working in the construction industry, he says, "Gives one a sense of pride when they can drive by a building and remember working there. Or when someone has a product from a factory you worked in, you can tell them... I helped make that."

Haberberger Inc. is Awarded Ameren Landfill Project

Ameren LFGTE Project

Haberberger, Inc. has been awarded the mechanical package for the new Ameren Landfill Gas to Energy (LFGTE) project, which will be constructed at the Fred Weber landfill in Creve Coeur, Mo. This landfill generates methane gas which will be collected and processed for use in three gas turbine generators producing 15

megawatts of electrical power or enough for approximately 10,000 homes.

Construction management and engineering is being provided by HR Green, of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Haberberger will be teaming up with Harke Sheet metal, Bieg Plumbing, Dynamic Controls and Thornburgh Insulation to complete the various mechanical, plumbing and HVAC systems on the project.

Construction is scheduled to start in March, 2011 with the mechanical work commencing in June 2011. Project completion is scheduled for the spring of 2012.

Haberberger Recognized by DBIA-MAR

Mechanical contracting firm Haberberger, Inc., was recently recognized by the Design-Build Institute of America - Mid-America Region (DBIA-MAR) in the category of "Best Project - Water/Wastewater under \$25 million" for its work at Hazelwood West High School. A Merit Award plaque was presented by the DBIA-MAR to Haberberger and Hazelwood West High School at the organization's 10th annual design-build awards. Haberberger served as both the contractual design-build team leader and designer of record on the project. The total contract amount for the project was \$99,094.

Under the leadership of Project Engineer John Gallia and Field Superintendent Rick Princivalli, Haberberger installed new vacuum-primed pumps on top of the existing wet well at Hazelwood West High School. Built in 1969, the existing pump station was located on school grounds in close proximity to the main building and consisted of a buried wet well connected to a buried pump valve. Sewage back-ups into the basement had become a common occurrence. The new wet well mounted pump station installed by Haberberger solved the sewage back-up issue. The new system was in place and running satisfactorily before the first day of school, and the district received a seamless design-build project delivered on time and without any cost increases.

DBIA-MAR evaluated project submissions in seven categories with a possible total score of 150 points. There were numerous entries, and a total of 13 projects received recognition. Each award-winning team received plaques for the builder, the designer and the owner.
